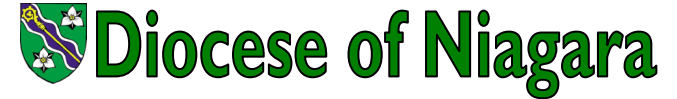


# JUST Resources



## **Faith and Justice**

*Why should Christians be concerned with justice-based approaches to ministry? You and your group are invited to journey through our scriptures, our covenants and our traditions as we grow in our understanding of God's mission of justice.*

## **Exploring Charity and Justice**

*This 1.5-2 hour interactive workshop will engage participants by offering an opportunity to reflect and deepen their understanding of compassionate responses to human need. The goal of the workshop is to explore and discern how God calls us to live with love through charity and service ministries as well as justice and advocacy ministries.*

## **Effective Advocacy**

*Political advocacy can be seen as part of our Christian commitment to love our neighbour and to seek justice. This 2 hour workshop will include an overview of the basic components to effectively raise the voice of your community to federal, provincial and municipal governments and includes an experiential learning challenge.*

## **Getting to Know Your Neighbours**

*Feeling disconnected from the needs of your neighbours or community? Unsure about what ministries and movements are happening in your neck of the woods? This three part experiential exercise empowers and equips parish leaders to better understand the context of their ministry environment and assist in discerning where God might be calling the community.*
